

Episode S7, Ep 31 - Students Interview Hannah: Mediumship, Parenting, Psychic Gifts, Predictions & Personal Truths

In this special interactive episode of Mediumship Matters, evidential medium Hannah Macintyre hands the microphone to her Gateway students — inviting them to ask absolutely anything they've always wanted to know. The result is a warm, funny, deeply honest conversation about mediumship, family life, psychic development, intuition, and the realities of

Music, Rap & "Stars in Their Eyes" — Hannah's Unlikely Warm-Up Routine The students open with a playful question:

If Hannah had to perform on Stars in Their Eyes, who would she be?

Her answer: Plan B — or possibly Iggy Azalea or the Fugees — because rap is how she psychs herself up before demonstrations.

She explains:

- She "raps the whole way" to a dem when driving alone
- She calls it "warming up the throat chakra" (but really, it's just fun)
- It burns off nerves and gets her in flow
- It also makes her "marginally asthmatic, true story"
- Would Hannah Want Her Daughter to Become a Medium?

A heartfelt question follows:

working spiritually in 2025.

What would you say if your daughter wanted to be a professional medium?

Hannah reflects:

- She'd be shocked no one in her house is particularly interested in mediumship
- Teenagers would rather "die than learn from their mum"
- She'd feel protective because mediumship is emotionally demanding
- But she would support her completely if it made her happy
- A mother's instinct is to worry no matter the profession

She also shares a sweet moment:

Her daughter once attended a live demonstration and finally understood what her mum actually does when she vanishes off to work.

What Does Hannah's Husband Believe?

Hannah shares candidly about her husband's relationship to her work:

- He used to worry what people would think
- · At first he asked her not to tell others what she did
- Over time, hearing people's spiritual experiences softened him
- He's "more of a believer than he used to be," especially after Hannah unexpectedly brought through someone he didn't know had died

Still:

- It's not "his bag"
- · He doesn't understand the constant vulnerability
- · Or why she repeatedly steps into emotional difficulty
- Or why she keeps going back to an exhausting profession

But he respects it - and sees its impact.

🜟 Demonstrations: Passion, Burnout & The Reality of 2025

Students ask if Hannah plans to return to more in-person demonstrations.

Her honest response:

- Demonstrating is her passion
- She loves live mediumship
- · But time, family life, and business logistics make it challenging
- · Social media changes mean she no longer reaches her own audience reliably
- · Events are harder to fill, making them financially risky
- She's committed to Canterbury this November but unsure about next year
- She's learning to "follow the energy" and surrender

Mediumship isn't just the event - it's:

- Travel
- Exhaustion
- Being away from home
- Emotional output
- And (currently) the unpredictable online landscape

This year is "another surrender year," watching to see where Spirit places her next.

* Are In-Person Courses Returning?

Right now: not many.

She still teaches:

- The upcoming January in-person training
- The international evidential week-long experience next year
- Occasional weekends (even when not profitable) because she honours commitments

But she also admits:

- Social media's decline has hit every industry
- She has limited financial flexibility while she invests heavily in Spirit Social
- She refuses large numbers because she wants meaningful connection

This is a recalibration year — not the end.

🜟 Predictions, Pregnancies & Driving Tests: Can Hannah "Fortune Tell"?

Students ask whether Hannah can instinctively predict:

- Driving test outcomes
- Baby genders
- Success in life events

Her answer:

- She can sometimes sense things spontaneously
- But forced prediction? No
- Free will makes many outcomes fluid
- Emotional involvement makes it harder
- Mediums who give major life predictions risk influencing people's choices

She explains:

- Some aspects of life are predestined (soul-contract anchor points)
- But the paths between them are flexible
- Predictions can become self-fulfilling or self-limiting

"People want a set of instructions," she laughs —

but mediumship isn't that kind of magic.

🜟 Are Mediums Who Saw Spirit as Children "Better"?

A common question in development circles:

Are mediums who saw Spirit as kids naturally more gifted?

Hannah reframes the whole conversation:

- Many claim they "saw spirit," yet can't describe loved ones accurately
- Some of the best mediums she has ever seen were not natural they were trained
- When it comes easily, people may not refine their skills
- When it doesn't, they work harder and become stronger practitioners

She adds:

- We all had psychic experiences as children
- We simply forget them
- Or our parents dismiss them
- Or the memory was never anchored by a reaction
- Children astral travelling, hearing names called, vivid visitation dreams all normal

Hannah even discovered years later that she herself heard spirit calling her name as a child, though she had no memory.

★ Manifesting, Soul Contracts & Privilege

A powerful discussion unfolds around Law of Attraction.

Hannah's view:

- Manifesting teachings often come from privileged positions
- She questions LOA influencers who would tell a child in poverty that their suffering is caused by mindset
- Soul contracts, circumstances, and chosen experiences shape lives
- Mindset does influence opportunities
- But not all outcomes are created equal

She summarises it well:

"It's not black and white. Manifesting is real — but it exists within a complex web of soul contracts, privilege, timing, and personal evolution."

🜟 Euphoria in Mediumship: Hannah's Most Magical Moments

Students ask:

What was your most euphoric mediumship experience?

She answers without hesitation:

Glastonbury.

Her last demonstration there felt extraordinary:

- The energy "just flowed"
- Evidence came with astonishing clarity
- She shocked herself
- The audience was spiritually open and supportive
- She felt truly herself in jeans, sparkles and trainers

It was everything a medium dreams of — effortless connection, laughter, validation, power. But she admits she is her own worst critic and often focuses on what she could have done better.

🜟 Unique Spirits, The Victorian Lady & Family History Mediumship

One student asks:

Has Hannah ever had a spirit from "ages ago"?

Yes — and a favourite story is the Victorian woman she brought through during a demonstration:

- · Hannah described her clothing, personality, carriage, and era
- She doubted anyone would recognise her
- But a woman researching her family tree exactly matched the evidence
- She later even sent Hannah a photograph of the ancestor

This experience proved how much more the spirit world can do when mediums push beyond the expected.

She also encourages students to try family-tree linking themselves — it can be amazing.

🜟 Can Spirit Communicate Across Language Barriers?

Absolutely.

- Spirit does not use a voice box
- Communication is energetic, not linguistic
- A sitter's language is irrelevant
- Only direct phrases in another language are hard, because the medium has no internal reference

Essence, emotion, personality and symbolic evidence all translate.

🜟 Life Chaos, Development & "Testing"

Students ask how Hannah managed mediumship development when life kept derailing her.

Hannah's answer is both comforting and confronting:

- Life chaos never stops not during development, not after
- You must choose your mediumship through the mess
- Sometimes Spirit pushes through discomfort to provoke action
- "Shaken-up bottle" energy often inspires breakthroughs
- Guilt, especially as a mother, is part of the journey
- She once left her crying daughter to go practise and still wrestles with it

But:

You never lose your mediumship.

It's "like riding a bike."

The moment you reach for Spirit, the link returns.

🐈 Books, Projects & What's Next

Students ask about future plans.

Hannah reveals:

- Book 2 is currently being edited
- Spirit nudged her to get on with it during a recent trip to Greece
- She's hoping to release it for Christmas
- Spirit Social has HUGE future expansions planned she can see "iteration 400" already
- She battles impatience because she wants everything built now
- But the evolution is steady and exciting

Many projects are simmering behind the scenes.

Mastermind Topic: What Else Does Hannah Know?

A fun closing question:

If Hannah were on Mastermind, what would her specialist subject be?

Her answers:

- Cooking
- Song lyrics (her brain stores thousands effortlessly)
- Stephen King novels

She cannot remember directions...

...but can recall 20-year-old lyrics perfectly.

(Spirit has a sense of humour.)

Closing Thoughts

The episode ends with laughter, gratitude and affection.

Hannah thanks her students for being kind — she was ready for "humdingers."

She reminds them she wouldn't be as gentle if the roles reversed.

This conversational, intimate episode offers a rare, behind-the-scenes look at her:

- as a mother
- as a medium
- as a teacher
- as a human navigating chaos, purpose and passion

A perfect addition to Season 7.
