Interview with Karin Huber

Welcome to Mediumship Matters!

Hello, and welcome to Mediumship Matters with me, Hannah Macintyre!

Today, I have a special guest joining me—my friend Karin Huber, who I met at Arthur Findlay College last summer. We had an absolute giggle together, and I knew I had to invite her onto the podcast to share her experiences with you. So, let's dive in!

Meet Karin Huber – Medium & Teacher in Germany

Hannah: Karin, welcome! So, keen listeners may have already picked up on your accent—you're based in Germany. Can you introduce yourself and tell us what you do?

Karin: Yes! I'm based in Frankfurt, Germany, where I run a center for mediumship development. I've been a full-time working medium and teacher for about ten years now, offering courses, mentorship, and mediumship readings.

Karin's Mediumship Journey – From Fear to Acceptance

Hannah: So, tell us—how did this journey start for you? Were you always aware of spirit?

Karin: Yes, I was! Since childhood, I've seen and felt spirit. When I was three or four years old, I would see people walking around my bedroom at night. Naturally, that terrified me. When I told my parents, they dismissed it, so I learned to keep quiet about it.

As I got older, I pushed my abilities aside—until my 40s, when I lost some people very dear to me. That's when spirit came knocking again. I couldn't ignore it anymore.

One day, while driving on the German autobahn, I suddenly saw a woman standing on the road. She was dressed in a long violet dress, 70s-style, with a hat. Instinctively, I slammed on the brakes—only to realize that she wasn't physically there. It was a spirit.

The near-accident shook me. I knew I had to do something about my mediumship—so I Googled courses and found Arthur Findlay College in England. At first, I wanted them to help me get rid of my abilities—but, well... you can guess how that turned out!

From “Get Rid of It” to “Embrace It” – Karin's Time at Arthur Findlay College

Hannah: So, you arrived at Arthur Findlay College (AFC) thinking, Help me switch this off!, and instead, you were told, You have potential! How did that feel?

Karin: Oh, I was completely overwhelmed! The energy of AFC is something else. The moment I walked in, I thought, This is like Hogwarts! The history, the atmosphere—it all felt so magical. My teachers pulled me aside and said, You're not here to shut this down. You're here to learn how to use it properly. That's when I realized—this wasn't something I could run from. I needed to embrace it.

Mediumship in Germany vs. the UK

Hannah: In the UK, we have spiritualist churches, public demonstrations, and the Spiritualist National Union (SNU). But that's not the case in Germany, is it?

Karin: No, not at all! When I first came to AFC in 2010, I couldn't find any structured mediumship training in Germany. Unlike in the UK, where mediumship is more openly accepted, there were only scattered courses with no real standard of teaching.

Germany doesn't have spiritualist churches the way the UK does. In fact, when I explain to my German friends that people in England attend church services expecting messages from loved ones, they're shocked! Mediumship is still quite underground here.

The Spiritualist National Union International (SNUi)

Hannah: You're the German representative for SNUi (the online branch of the SNU)—what does that involve?

Karin: SNUi was created to expand spiritualism internationally. It offers online courses, mentorship, and community spaces for students worldwide. In Germany, we now have around 100 members, and it's growing!

With my colleague Iris Bucha from Switzerland, we run monthly mediumship courses in German—because while many Germans speak English, it's easier to develop mediumship in your native language.

The Challenge of Translating Mediumship

Hannah: I'm always amazed at mediums who work in multiple languages. It's hard enough to trust the messages without also translating them in real-time! How did you manage that?

Karin: It was really hard at first! At AFC, I started in English-speaking courses, but I struggled with certain phrases and concepts. When you're in the flow of mediumship, you don't have time to stop and think, Wait, what's the right word in English?

Now, I work exclusively in German for readings and teaching—but I translate English-speaking teachers when needed.

The Difference Between German & UK Sitters

Hannah: You've worked with both UK and German audiences—are they different?

Karin: Absolutely! German audiences tend to be very precise and analytical. They expect exact wording and can be more skeptical. British sitters are often more open and accepting of interpretations.

For example, if I describe a communicator as "kind but strict," a British sitter might say, "That sounds like him!" A German sitter might say, "No, he was firm but fair—not strict." The tiniest wording change can throw them off!

Karin's Teaching & Mediumship Offerings

Karin offers:

- ✓ Year-long courses for beginner & advanced students.
- ✓ One-on-one mentorship.
- ✓ Mediumship readings (spirit communication only).
- ✓ Workshops in Germany & online.

Her focus is on mental mediumship, spirit communication, and practical development.

Karin's Advice for Developing Mediums

- 💡 Be kind to yourself. Mediumship isn't a race—take your time.
- 💡 Trust that spirit has no deadlines. They won't rush you.
- 💡 Integration is key. Don't just seek more knowledge—take time to absorb it.
- 💡 Let go of control. The spirit world works in its own way and timing.
